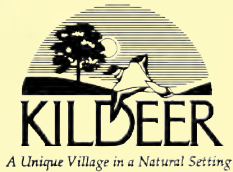


Solid Waste & Recycling Collection Guide

The Village recently extended its contract with Waste Management to provide residents with an expanded recycling program and three choices for trash service. Residents are encouraged to recycle more of their waste and during the month of March each year residents can upgrade from a Waste Management 65 gal. recycling cart (the one with the

yellow lid) to a Waste Management 96 gal. cart at no charge during the month of March each year. Changing the cart size during any other month costs \$25.

The contract extension also provides for three trash options: 1) continuation of the current unlimited residential curbside service (use your own cans or bags) for \$17.62/month, 2) unlimited service using your own cans or bags and one Waste Management 96 gal. trash cart for \$20.63/month, or 3) residential trash pickup limited to one Waste Management 65 gal. trash cart for \$17.50/month. Residents who choose option 3 who may have additional trash to be picked-up can purchase stickers at Village Hall for \$2.75 each.

Offering a limited trash option and free upgrading to a 96 gal. recycling cart are part of Kildeer's efforts to promote recycling, control disposal costs, and extend to life of the landfills. **To upgrade your recycling cart or change your trash service, please contact Waste Management's Customer Service at 800-796-9696 between 7:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.**



General Guidelines

- All solid waste materials must not be placed out at the curb for collection earlier than 5:00 p.m. the day before your pick-up. Please keep in mind that separate trucks pick up trash, recycling and yard waste, so each of these materials may be picked up at different times of the day. Garbage and recycling should be separated by the drive and at least 5 feet from stationary objects (mailboxes, basketball hoops, vehicles, etc.).
- Carts should be placed handle toward house, along the curb.
- All containers and any solid waste materials that are not collected must be removed from the curb by 8:00 a.m. the day after your scheduled collection.
- Provided carts are the property of Waste Management and are not to be removed from the property.

Recycling

In 2011 the average Kildeer home set out 1,311 pounds of recycling or 25.2 pounds per week. That adds up to 1.6 million pounds per year diverted from the landfill by Kildeer's residents, giving the Village a 35.7% recycling rate. The goal endorsed by Lake County, SWALCO and the Village of Kildeer is to achieve a 60% rate by 2016. You can help attain that goal by upgrading to a 96 gal. recycling cart and reducing the amount of trash you throw away. Don't "pay as you throw"--recycle!

Recycling and Redirecting Other Items

Composting

In addition to creating mulch for yards and gardens, composting at home means residents will dispose of less material. Composting is nature's way of recycling and has been going on since the beginning of time. It is the biological process of breaking down organic waste such as food waste, leaves, grass trimmings, paper, coffee grounds and other materials into an extremely useful final product.

Today, the use of composting to turn organic wastes into a valuable resource is expanding rapidly around the world, as landfill space becomes scarce and expensive, and as people become more aware of the value of compost and the impact they have on the environment. Household Chemical Waste (HCW)

Household Chemical Waste (HCW) and household hazardous waste are terms used to describe common products used in a variety of cleaning, decorating, pest control, home repair and yard work activities. Careless storage and disposal of these items can pose serious environmental and human health threats.

SWALCO (Solid Waste Agency of Lake County) offers free HCW collections for residents. Mobile Collections Events are held at various locations throughout Lake County from April through November. Year-Round Collection events are held at SWALCO's facility in Gurnee multiple times per month – by appointment only. Schedule your appointment at www.swalco.org or call 847-336-9340.

These collections are for residential waste only, business, commercial and industrial waste will be turned away.

Residential Electronics Recycling

Beginning January 1, 2012, the Illinois' Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act's landfill ban for certain electronic devices will take effect. The following electronic items will no longer be accepted in either your regular trash or recycling container:



TV's, monitors, printers, computers (including tablet computers), keyboards, mice, scanners, fax machines, VCRs, DVD players & recorders, portable digital music players, video game systems, small servers, satellite receivers, cable receivers and digital converter boxes. Kildeer residents should direct these and other household electronic items to a residential electronics recycling collection event hosted by SWALCO. 

Yard Waste

Yard waste is collected weekly April – November on your scheduled pickup day.






- Must be placed in biodegradable Kraft paper bags/cans (maximum 32 gal. and 45 lbs.) for collection. Yard waste placed in plastic bags will not be collected.
- Customer is allowed unlimited yardwaste with yardwaste seasonal program or they may purchase yardwaste stickers through our office.



LAKE COUNTY CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES

PLACE THESE ITEMS TOGETHER IN YOUR RECYCLING CART LOOSE, NOT BAGGED.	ACCEPTABLE 	NOT ACCEPTABLE 
Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogs, Books, Phone Books 	Includes ads, inserts, postcards, hard cover, soft cover & misc. paper.	Materials should be free of plastic bags and wrappers.
Cardboard	Flatten boxes. Large boxes must be cut into pieces no larger than 3' x 3'.	DO NOT include cardboard that contains food residue or wax-coating.
Scrap paper, Shredded paper, Paper cartons, Paper cups 	Include mail, envelopes, copy paper, office paper, greeting cards, paper egg cartons, milk, juice & other beverage cartons, paper tubes, wrapping paper and cereal/food boxes. Place shredded paper into paper bags.	DO NOT include bath tissue, paper towels, photos, laminated paper or paper coated with food, wax or foil. Remove plastic bags and plastic wrappers.
Household plastic containers #1 PET: water & soda bottles #2 HDPE: milk, detergent, shampoo containers #3 V: chemical, cooking oil containers #4 LDPE: lids, caps, rings, six-pack rings #5 PP: yogurt, butter, cosmetic containers	Plastic containers numbered 1-5 including caps, rings, lids, & labels. 	Containers should be empty and free of excess liquids & food residue. Plastics numbered 6 & 7 cannot be recycled in Lake County. DO NOT include utensils, plates, toys or garden hoses.

LAKE COUNTY CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES

PLACE THESE ITEMS TOGETHER IN YOUR RECYCLING CART LOOSE, NOT BAGGED.	ACCEPTABLE 	NOT ACCEPTABLE 
Metal Cans 	Includes aluminum, tin, & steel food and spray cans. Caps, lids, pull tabs, & labels may remain on the containers. Place metal lids inside cans.	Containers should be empty and free of excess liquids & food residue. DO NOT include fire extinguishers, propane & helium gas tanks, utensils, hangers, or small appliances, batteries or auto parts.
Aluminum Foil	Aluminum foil & foil trays.	Foil should be free of food residue.
Glass Containers 	Glass bottles & jars. Mix all colors together. Caps, lids, rings & labels may remain on the containers.	DO NOT include light bulbs, mirrors, bakeware, ceramics, drinking glasses, window & auto glass.
 RECYCLE PLASTIC BAGS Plastic bags and wrappers should be stuffed into one bag and tied closed. Recycle them at your nearest participating grocery or retail store.		Items on the NOT ACCEPTED list may contaminate an entire load of recyclables and SHOULD NOT be placed in your recycling cart or bin. Please be mindful as you recycle. NO auto parts NO holiday lights NO batteries NO utensils NO food/garbage NO wire NO combustibles NO toys NO foam NO hangers NO paint cans NO needles/syringes
