The Lake County 2019 Solid Waste Management Plan Update recognizes the importance of sustainable waste management in reducing greenhouse gases and the essential role the shift to a circular economy will have in driving economic growth in the 21st century. Historically waste management has been viewed in a linear fashion: produce the product, use the product, and then landfill it when done. That model is not sustainable and leaders of business and government throughout the world now recognize the need for a new model to sustain economic growth and combat climate change: the circular economy model.

The goals of the Workshop will be to provide you with a deeper understanding of the circular economy model, how it is already working in Lake County, and how we can work together to strengthen it.
